The IRP is PWP's roadmap for ensuring reliable, cost-effective and environmentally responsible electric supply for its customers over the next twenty years. The IRP takes into consideration electricity rates, future energy demand, environmental impacts, conservation and

energy efficiency, among many other factors.

At this second of four public meetings on the IRP, Pace Global Energy Services, LLC, the energy resource planning consultant recently retained by the City to assist in the development of the IRP, will present preliminary data on the projected cost and environmental impacts of the various energy resource scenarios under consideration. A public discussion will follow on how to balance Pasadena's economic, environmental, and service reliability objectives when setting the city's long-term energy policy.

PWP, the City Council Municipal Services Committee, and the City's Environmental Advisory Commission will hold more public meetings about the IRP throughout the year.
